As we come in to the summer months and the weather warms up, the competition season at BREC comes to a close. This means we will start to run more In-House evening competitions and what better way to start them off than with a Show Jumping competition! This competition will be held on Friday 27th May and will be open for everyone to enter. Classes will start at 50cm and go up to 90cm. The in-house competitions are a really good idea for anyone wanting to gain confidence competing but in a relaxed, familiar environment.

Stable Management Mornings

Once again, this month's Fun Stable Management sessions that we run on a Sunday morning have been a huge success! Therefore we will be continuing with these again. Remember we run 2 sessions, the first from 9-10 and the second from 10-11. You do not have to commit to a course, you can just sign up week by week as and when you please.



We will be running 4 camps during the summer holidays. We will be running a Dressage specific camp, a Show Jumping specific camp and 2 general camps. Riders wanting to attend either the Show Jumping or Dressage camps need to be at least blue level. These camps are aimed at more experienced rides and are going to focus on competition riding. All riders will need to be assessed and approved by Deborah before signing up. The general camp is open to anyone who is off of the lead rein and confident it Walk & Trot.

The proposed dates for the camps are as follows: Please will anyone who is interested in attending let the office know as soon as possible to ensure the dates are going to be suitable for as many people as possible.

General Camp: 6th - 8th July & 10th – 12th August Show Jumping specific camp: 11th – 13th July Dressage specific camp: 25th – 27th July



If you are interested in taking out a short term livery on a horse or pony over the summer, please as the office about availability. Having livery on a horse will entitle you to ride that horse 4 times a week. Three times through the week and once over the weekend. The livery agreement can be flexible and of different lengths ranging from 1 week to 2 months.



We will be running a half day IPRASM training day. The day will start by working through the syllabus and developing everyone's skills to try and encourage them to get to the next level. The latter part of the session will be spent being assessed. Anyone who successfully completes each unit will have them signed off and anyone who completes a whole level will receive their certificate. We will confirm the date later.
